# **Linda Carroll Baldwin - the early years**

Linda, born at Mare Island Naval Base Hospital (San Francisco), in September of 1941, is the daughter of John "Johnny" Baldwin (1909-1967) and Dorothy Lee Dixon (1918-1993). Her early years were marked by the fact that World War 2 was in progress with her father, US Navy Chief Quartermaster, stationed on Navy ships locally and in the South Pacific and her mother maintaining the family household. We have a few documents and photos from that period which give us a glimpse into her early life and the lives of her parents.


### **LETTER TO LINDA FROM JOHN, JULY 1942**

At the time of this letter, John was serving on the USS Catalpa in the Fiji Islands, South Pacific. The Catalpa was a brand new ship, launched February 1941, and was assigned to serve the U.S. Navy ships and harbors during World War II with her protective anti-submarine net.
